After considerable investigation, not a single manufacturer could be found who knits, or could be persuaded to knit, right and left stockings. Probably all of the right and left stockings

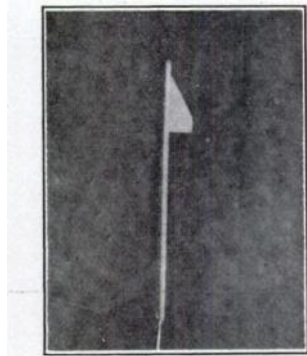

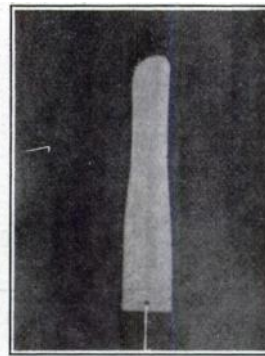
